## Ovid-Elsie Special Meeting Superintendent Update

ELSIE – A special meeting of the Ovid-Elsie Board of Education was held Thursday, December 8, 2022, 7 pm for an update presented by interim superintendent Mr. Randy Barton.

Prior to the update, under public comment, Kellie Nethaway, questioned the purpose of the special meeting. Currently, it is her understanding that Mr. Barton has been given a one-year contract. She questioned if he would be hired or not. What is the process? If there is a process, what is it and is it being followed.

The purpose, is to update officials and the public on Barton's reflection of the first 90 days as interim superintendent, and then a 1- and three-year vision for the district.

First, thirty days, there have been staffing challenge with 21 new staff members and the opening of the line of communication with all of the bargaining units and to establishing relationships. It has also been an opportunity to review the strategic plan that was approved in 2016. It was at the time the motto "Students first," was established. So, what went well – growth in student achievement, growth in academic classes AP and dual enrollment, PBIS implementation, and the district received an \$80,000 technology grants. There was shared leadership and then improving communication through career fairs, community experts. Areas that need improvement – maintaining quality employees, increased support for special education and mental health needs, communications with community, and recovering our pre-pandemic student achievement trajectory.

It should be noted that during the pandemic students did not thrive on distance learning and will be focused on moving forward.

Barton's vision for the one-year plan – restructured administrative team and recommending Randy Barton as superintendents, Dan Davenport, Associate superintendent and HR; Karle Delo as Director of instruction and seek an accountant.; high school, middle school and elementaries as is with the addition of an alternative high school administrator.

Next, student achievement – high quality professional learning for teachers; continue coaching program including PBL, continued curriculum work; build a teacher mentor program, student success coaches, and retaining district nurse.

In addition, build a positive culture beginning with the public causing a problem with retaining with staff. Develop a communication team, increase community involvement, promote a positive culture within buildings (PBIS multi-tiered system).

Recruit and maintain a quality staff, the most concerning, 66% less individuals going into the profession. Provide support with current and future teachers. Attend job fairs and careers, celebrate and empower staff members, and improving building-level structures.

The plan will also maintain a healthy budget – complete a 5-year enrollment projection from an outside consultant; hire a new business manager, and new financial and or HR software. Continue looking at five-year plan for buildings and grounds; consider how we can maintain transportation system; and maintain a 15-20% equity fund balance to plan contingencies.

The plan addresses training for Board Members – 2023 meeting schedule roles and responsibilities and evaluation system. Future training for board members, as well.

Three-year plan involves revisiting the five-year plan – provides for stakeholder input and measurable outcomes. In addition, leverage grant money, to fund capital projects that will gain 20 years' service like roofs, and buses. Recruit and maintain a quality staff; maintain a healthy fund equity, continue to promote student achievement and address student needs, intentional what is taught and re-evaluate the assessments. Consider priority-based budgeting instead of zero-based budgeting.

In closing Randy Barton stated, "We will continue to face challenges. We will create a strategic plan to address these issues beginning with a strong leadership team. Goal, to make Ovid-Elsie a destination district for students, families, and teachers with a high standard for student achievement."

Following adjournment Barton sat down with community members and concerned citizens to address questions.

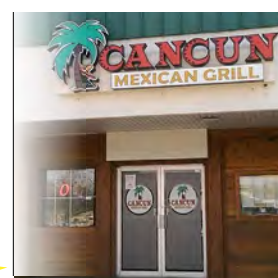

Parsons won by pin at 126 pounds while Workman registered a 15-0 technical fall victory at 138 pounds for coach Kyle Spiess' Marauders.

### Baynes Stays Hot, Laingsburg Does Too in a Big Win at Saranac

SARANAC — Ellie Baynes registered a double-double with 17 points and 13 rebounds, and Laingsburg's varsity girls basketball team raced to its 4th win in as many tries at Saranac. The 38-27 victory saw coach Doug Hurst's Wolves (4-0, 2-0 in the CMAC) overcome a sub-par free throw night (6-for-15) with solid team play and distribution of the basketball. Baynes finished with five assists and four steals, while junior Bella Strieff scored a career-high 10 points and added 8 rebounds.

"It's always tough playing at Saranac — a long ride over there and we struggled," Hurst explained. "We had a major let-down in the middle of the game and Saranac made a run at us. It was ugly but the girls got the job done."

The Redhawks scrapped hard through the 2nd half, limiting LHS to a one-point scoring advantage, 17-16.

Kyleigh Luna scored four points for Laingsburg while Mallory Woodbury added eight rebounds and two points. Ella Merrell scored 2 and Ashlee Hawes 3 to round out the LHS scoring.

## Positive Attitudes Have Marauder Bowling Teams Ready to Roll Again

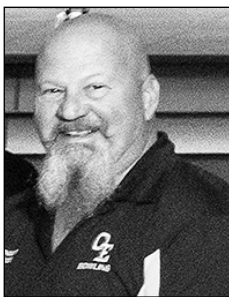
OVID-ELSIE — The power of positive thinking is helping anchor the Marauder bowling teams as they enter the 2022-23 seasons.

There's a lot to like on the lanes this winter with O-E, Fabus explains. "Our teammates always pick each other up and stay focused on the game," he says.



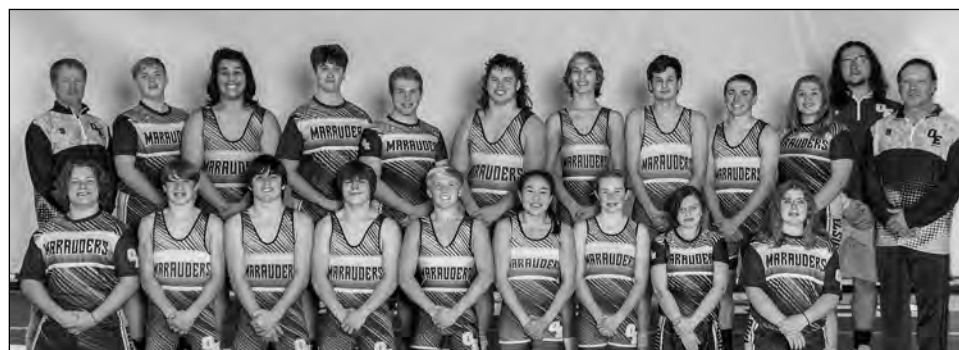
